It examines if, and how, personalised choices can facilitate the recovery journey and what needs to change both systemically and culturally to ensure that they do. Through links with the National Social Inclusion Programme and the New Ways of Working for Social Work group, SPN also seeks to promote the importance of social care and social work.

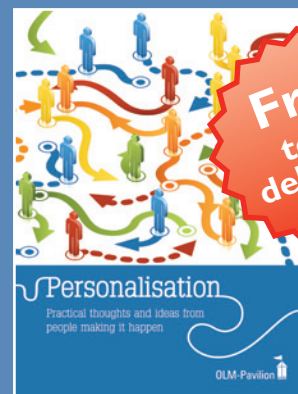
